The curriculum, made up of core music, music industry, music technology, and business courses, combines a rigorous introduction to the artistic, financial, and managerial skills which are necessary to succeed in the music industry. Music Industry students will be provided with the critical and creative space to innovate, integrate and adapt as next-generation transformational thinkers in an ever-evolving global music business.

In exceptional cases a change from one instrument to another may be permitted in the major area with the approval of the instructors involved and the department head.
- Two (2) ensembles/semester. Freshman and Sophomore students will take 100/200 level ensembles and Junior and Senior students will take 300/400 level ensembles.
